Some years ago, there was a popular but controversial book about an obscure prayer by an unknown leader named Jabez. In a few short verses, this faithful follower found himself in the Hall of Faith for his bold petition to God.

"Jabez was more honorable than his brothers. His mother had named him Jabez, saying, 'I gave birth to him in pain.' Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, 'Oh, that You would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let Your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain.' And God granted his request." (1 Chronicles 4:9-10 NIV)

Some devoured the thought of praying this prayer regularly and being greatly blessed. But not all. Others disagreed with the concept that God's blessings would follow so effortlessly by simply reciting these words.

Whatever one thinks, the account of this man and his prayer is found in the Bible, along with many other unbelievable experiences and encounters.

With the recent announcement from Bishop Palmer, I couldn't help but think of this passage. While I have not been actively and eagerly praying that God would "enlarge my territory," it is coming to pass and I will need to make adjustments in how I manage my self, my time and my service.

Effective July 1, 2024, I will become the Superintendent of the Scioto River District as well as of the Hocking River District. With the announcement of Rev. Calvin Alston's impending retirement, Bishop Palmer invited me to prayerfully consider expanding my responsibilities.

While the overall area will include twenty counties in southern and southeastern Ohio, the total number of churches and pastors will be fewer than what the former Foothills District had a few short years ago when I started this journey with you.

And, while I was not praying for God to enlarge my territory, I will be praying that God's hand will be upon us and will keep us from harm as I oversee the 140 churches and 90 or so pastors of these two Districts.

I covet your prayers as I begin a new adventure: a different version of a two point charge.

"And Jabez called on the God of Israel saying, 'Oh, that You would bless me indeed, and enlarge my territory, that Your hand would be with me, and that You would keep me from evil, that I may not cause pain!" So God granted him what he requested." (I Chronicles 4:10 NKJV)

Chow named Superintendent of Scioto River and Hocking River Districts

Bishop Gregory V. Palmer has announced Rev. Mark Chow will serve as Scioto River District Superintendent effective July 1. He replaces Rev. Calvin Alston who will retire at the end of the conference year. Chow will continue to serve as the district superintendent of the Hocking River District.

"I am humbled and honored to serve the people of both the Scioto River and Hocking River Districts," Chow said. "With your prayers and God's grace, I look forward to this opportunity to serve God."

Bishop Palmer met with the district superintendency committees ahead of the announcement. Both districts are similar culturally and regionally.

"Mark has served all over West Ohio. It is hard for me to think of anybody who exudes servant leadership more than Mark," said Bishop Palmer.

Chow holds a Bachelor of Arts in speech-theater from Ohio Northern University and a Master of Divinity from Asbury Theological Seminary. He was ordained an elder in the West Ohio Conference in 1989.

Born in Iowa, Chow and his family lived in Pennsylvania and Kentucky before moving to Ohio where his father, the late Rev. W. Jing Chow, served several churches in the West Ohio Conference.

He is married to Nancy Schumacher-Chow. They are the parents of four adult daughters: Jayme, Jenn, Deborah, and Molly. They are also grandparents to Henry and Rachel.

Basic & Recert ERT Class to be offered March 2 in Beavercreek

UMCOR's Early Response Team (ERT) Basic class will be offered on Saturday, March 2, 8:00 am-4:00 pm at Aley UMC in Beavercreek. A four-hour recertification class will also be offered. West Ohio ERT trainers will teach participants how to assist survivors of natural disasters in their time of need. Trainees will learn how to provide a caring, Christian presence while taking steps to prevent further damage to the family's personal property. Skills that are taught include tarping, debris removal, mucking out flooded homes, etc. FEMA recognizes this training to enter a disaster scene. A background check is required, and a link to complete this will be provided upon registration. Bryan Stevenson of "Just Mercy" Leadership Clinic March 11 - Online

Bryan Stevenson, founder and Executive Director of the Equal Justice Initiative (EJI), a human rights organization will be the featured guest for Bishop Palmer's Leadership Clinic on March 11, 2024.

Under his leadership, EJI has won major legal challenges eliminating excessive and unfair sentencing, exonerating innocent death row prisoners, confronting abuse of the incarcerated and the mentally ill, and aiding children prosecuted as adults. Mr. Stevenson has received over 50 honorary doctoral degrees and numerous awards.

He is the author of the critically acclaimed New York Times bestseller, <u>Just Mercy</u>, which was named by Time Magazine as one of the ten Best Books of the year. *Just Mercy* was adapted as a major motion picture. Mr. Stevenson is also the subject of the Emmy Award-winning HBO documentary True Justice. He is a graduate of the Harvard Law School and the Harvard School of Government.

EAST AND WEST OHIO CONFERENCES TO SHARE AN EPISCOPAL LEADER **EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2024**

A special-called session of the North Central Jurisdiction (NCJ) Jurisdictional Conference of The United Methodist Church was held on Tuesday, January 23 "for the sole purpose of approving new episcopal areas for episcopal assignments to be effective September 1, 2024."

Delegates to this special-called NCJ Jurisdictional Conference voted to form two new episcopal areas, one to include the East Ohio Conference and the West Ohio Conference, and one to include the Northern Illinois Conference and the Wisconsin Conference. The two conferences in each new episcopal area will share one bishop.

By the action of the special session, the North Central Jurisdiction will transition from nine to seven episcopal areas. The North Central Jurisdiction Committee on the Episcopacy assigns the bishops to the episcopal areas and all assignments will be announced at the NCJ Jurisdictional Conference July 10-13 in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. The new episcopal areas and the bishop assignments to each of the seven episcopal areas will be effective September 1.

Executive staff leaders and members of the Committee on the Episcopacy in both the East Ohio Conference and the West Ohio Conference have been engaged in strategic conversations to explore the sharing of an episcopal leader since the NCJ Committee on the Episcopacy proposed the possibility during the 2022 Jurisdictional Conference.

"I and Bishop Palmer convened a leadership team that has been working to identify the key administrative matters that need to be addressed and to examine the best practices of other episcopal areas where shared episcopal leadership has worked well. This work will continue as we prepare the conferences for this transition," said Bishop Tracy S. Malone, resident bishop of the East Ohio Conference.

"I am confident the people of the East and West Ohio Conferences are well suited to be served by one bishop with a single eye to living the mission of 'making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world," said Bishop Gregory V. Palmer, resident bishop of the West Ohio Conference.
