News and Notes --- March 5, 2025

Today is Ash Wednesday. We begin the season of Lent with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Since it's a day of confession, I must confess that I have often chosen to use the other option for the words as I have shared the ashes, "Repent, and believe the gospel." As I reflect on why, I guess it is because it seems more positive, even easier. Repent and believe-these are things that we can do, feel better, and move on.



The words about the dust are different. They are not about what we do, but who we are. They are a reminder of something essential that we cannot escape or avoid. It's not only that we use to be dust or will be dust, but that we are dust.

We are dust. It's hard enough to process the phrase from the funeral liturgy, "ashes to ashes, dust to dust," but to think of ourselves as dust right now is humbling. It changes our perspective on everything.

If we are dust, then we are all equally dust, and we are all part of a larger whole. When we claim that we are dust, we are not only accepting that we are one small piece of something, we are also claiming that we are connected to the whole of the universe. We are connected to each and every person and element of creation.

Most of the time we resist that. We like to think of ourselves as independent and unique and better than. We distance ourselves from each other and other groups. We like to think that somehow, we have escaped dust, at least for a while.

But on Ash Wednesday, when we hear these words spoken as dust is put on our foreheads, we experience a connection--with the dust that makes up the cross on our forehead, with all of the once living things that made that dust, with the one who is putting the dust on our foreheads, with those in the room with us, and most of all to the one who takes all of the dust and causes it to cling together for a time and breathes the breath of life into it.

Ash Wednesday reminds us that we are connected to all of the dust in the universe and all of the creation that God has called good. It reminds us to live in ways that honor that connection. The season of Lent is the invitation to consider all the ways we have been disconnected and all of the things we have done to cause that disconnection to God, self, others, the church, and the universe, to repent and then to commit ourselves to believe in the good news again—that we are one in Jesus Christ, connected to the one who became dust for us, connected and living in his love and grace.

- An Accessibility Audit, which is required in the Book of Discipline. This report can be completed online.
- The **Green Church Audit**, which is required per General Conference action in 2024. This report should be completed then uploaded online.

The West Ohio Conference Commission on Archives and History is requesting that each congregation in the West Ohio Conference submit an updated **Local Church History Survey Form** this spring. If you currently don't have a recorded church history or a Church Historian, please involve your members who may best recall your church's history and start the documentation process.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Annual Fund Balance Report (Audit). Please take this report and financial review process seriously. When there is mismanagement of funds it is not only the dollar loss that is significant, but the loss of credibility, energy for ministry, and focus on making disciples of Jesus Christ, as well. Remember that *this Fund Balance Report should be done by someone who does not have access to incoming or outgoing funds*.

Annual Conference is May 28-31, 2025

The 56th session of the West Ohio Conference will be held May 28 - May 31, again this year at Capital University in Bexley. This will be the first Ohio Episcopal Area annual conference in which Bishop Hee-Soo Jung presides. The theme for the session is Rise Up, Beloved: Trust in God's Promises, inspired by Mark 5:35-43, where Jesus encourages Jairus, a synagogue leader, to have faith that his deceased daughter will be raised from the dead.
