Celebrating a new church in our district - Bethlehem Bhutanese UMC!

"Yesterday [Sunday, March 30th] marked an historic moment as we celebrated the launch of Bethlehem Bhutanese United Methodist Church in Cincinnati—Ohio's first ever Bhutanese UM congregation.

This vibrant new church adds a beautiful thread to the rich tapestry of United Methodism, embodying the diversity and unity of God's family.

The Bhutanese community in Ohio traces its roots to the early 1990s, when political and ethnic tensions in Bhutan forced many ethnic Nepali Bhutanese to flee. After enduring decades in refugee camps in Nepal, they began resettling in the US in 2008 through a national refugee initiative. Thankfully Ohio became a welcoming home for thousands, with Cincinnati emerging as a key hub for this resilient community. Over time, these families built lives grounded in culture, faith, and hope—leading to the founding of Bethlehem Bhutanese UMC.

This congregation is a gift, not only to Cincinnati but to the entire UMC connection. Their deep faith, rich cultural identity, and dedication to community remind us that the Church shines brightest when it reflects the global body of Christ.

We give thanks for the nearly 150 people, including city officials who gathered yesterday to celebrate this milestone. Every number has a name, every name has a story, and every story matters to God.

Thank you Forest Chapel UMC and Rev. Kabamba Kiboko for nurturing this community and following the Spirit.

Join us in welcoming this new chapter in our UMC story—where love, faith, and community continue to flourish."



Love Thy Self: Vicarious Trauma Self-Care Workshop

Our lives are constantly being bombarded with images and experiences of seismic shifts, suffering, loss, chaos, and hopelessness to change the situation. Whether being done to us or around us, our inevitable absorption of these “traumatic stressors” shows up in our psyche, behaviors, and relationships in unhealthy ways. The bottom line is that showing up as our best selves in ministry and service takes self-care.



A 2-hour workshop taking place on April 11 at 12pm will help prepare you to recognize the mental and emotional signs that indicate the need for some self-care in the face of exposure to life's traumatic stressors. You will walk away with education, tools, and practices for self-protection against vicarious trauma and for healing from it when experiences overwhelm.
